"It is a similar investment strategy to that of most home owners over time where they might buy a house that needs renovating, do it up and then take a

"It is a strategy that supports Chris, is an investment for us and also gives us an enjoyable family home."

Peter said the most impressive thing about working with Chris as the designer was the huge amount of detail.

"Virtually every item is custom made," he said. "All windows, cupboard doors and the front door were custom made.

"The pool and the pond are designed

for this space. All the internal joinery, kitchen and vanities, staircase and handrails were all custom made.

"The Colorbond gutters including the gutter brackets were all also especially made.

"Nothing was standard or off-theshelf."

However, Peter and Janet Clout are already planning their next adventure and the home is now on the market with Tom Offermann Real Estate agents John Dover and Petar Markanovic.
