Coast design talent in state spotlight

EACH year the Sunshine Coast branch of the Building Designers Association of Queensland (BDAQ) honours outstanding efforts in the building design industry with the Queensland Building Design Awards.

The awards recognise it takes a special client, an excellent designer and a dedicated team of contractors to make an award-winning building.

Registered building designers enter completed projects into different categories including best custom-designed home, best renovations and best commercial buildings.

The awards are given to those building designers whose projects are both attractive in style and innovative in function, reflect Queensland living and are environmentally efficient.

BDAQ Sunshine Coast president, Eddie Baden said the association has seen an improvement in the industry during the past three years.

"I have seen a growth in the association and its membership, an improvement in standard of training and an increase in people attending the professional development courses," he said.

"I have seen an increase in all facets of building design work."

Although he agreed there was a high quality of building designers Australia-wide, it's hard to go past local talent.

"I would believe the building design industry on the Sunshine Coast is the best in Queensland because it has a style of its own and that is displayed by the Sunshine Coast having won the national award last year," he said.

The category winners will continue on to the state and national awards.

The BDAQ formed in 1990 to give recognition to an important profession in the building industry, building designers.

It is estimated between 75-80% of dwellings and around 45% of commercial buildings are designed by building designers.

As part of the Queensland government's program to protect consumers in the construction industry, building designers are licensed by the Building Services Authority. BDAQ has 11 branches covering from far-north Queensland to the Gold Coast.

As the name suggests, a building designer designs buildings ranging from a family home to a multi-storey commercial complex.

Building designers can design a building that is energy efficient and comfortable, provides value for money and is suitable for specific needs.

The designers take into account clients' lifestyle, budget, site conditions, poten tial resale and long term maintenance costs.
